

WHAT GOES IN THE BLUE BIN?

Recycling tips

- Rinse clean, remove food, liquids, contents before recycling
- Put items in loose and not bagged (except for shredded paper – put in clear plastic bag)

TOGETHER IN ONE BIN

Glass

- Bottles, jars

Plastics (*Black plastic items cannot be recycled*)

- Tubs, lids
- Clear food containers
- Disposable plates, cups, berry containers
- Detergent, hand soap, shampoo bottles
- Beverage bottles
- Cat litter tubs with plastic handles
- Soft, stretchy plastics (milk bags, sandwich bags, grocery bags, soil bags, water/soft drink cases, frozen fruit/vegetable bags, diaper outer bags)

Metal

- Aluminum / steel cans
- Aluminum trays, burner liners, pie plates, roasting pans
- Aerosol cans (**must be empty**)
- Paint cans (**empty, dried**)

Milk Cartons/Tetra Paks

- Wax coated milk and juice cartons
- Drinking boxes and soup broth



SEPARATE FROM THE REST

Paper

- Bags, advertising mail, envelopes
- Shredded paper
- Gift wrap, cards (no ribbons, bows, foil wrap)
- Newspapers, flyers, directories, magazines, catalogues
- Soft/hard cover books

Cardboard

- Boxboard (cereal, tissue, detergent, shoe, flatten)
- Corrugated cardboard (clean, unwaxed, pizza boxes, soft drink cases, flattened)
- Rolls (toilet, paper towel)
- Cans (chips, nuts, frozen juice)
